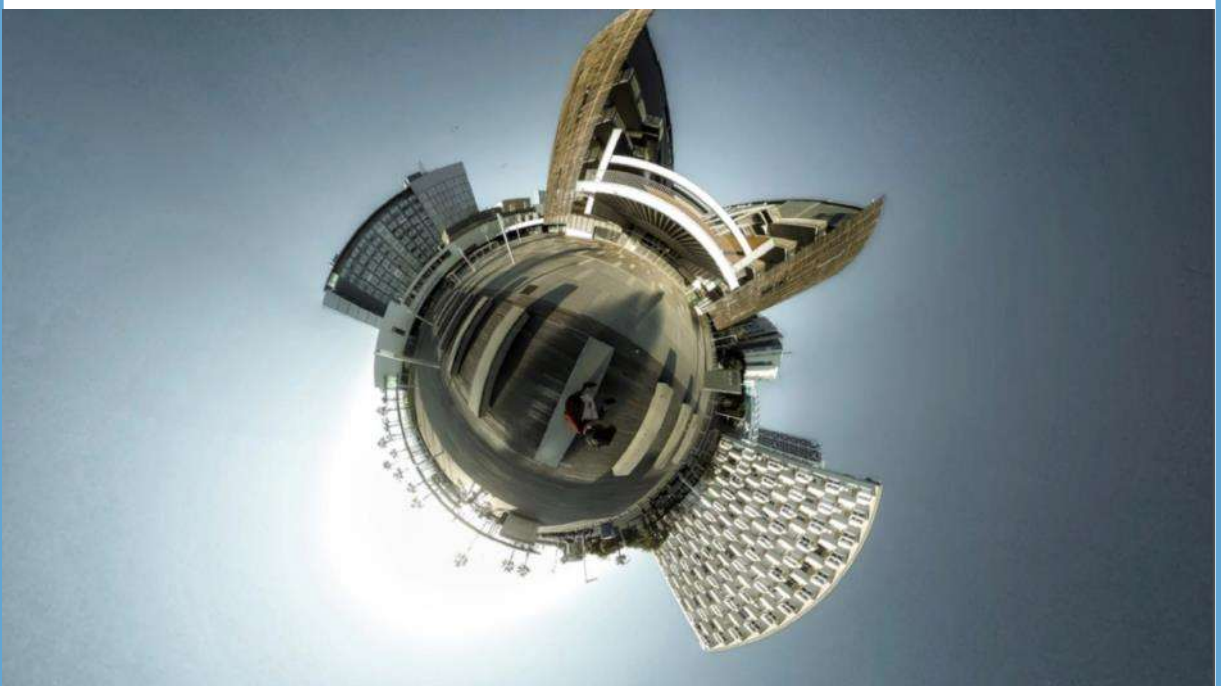

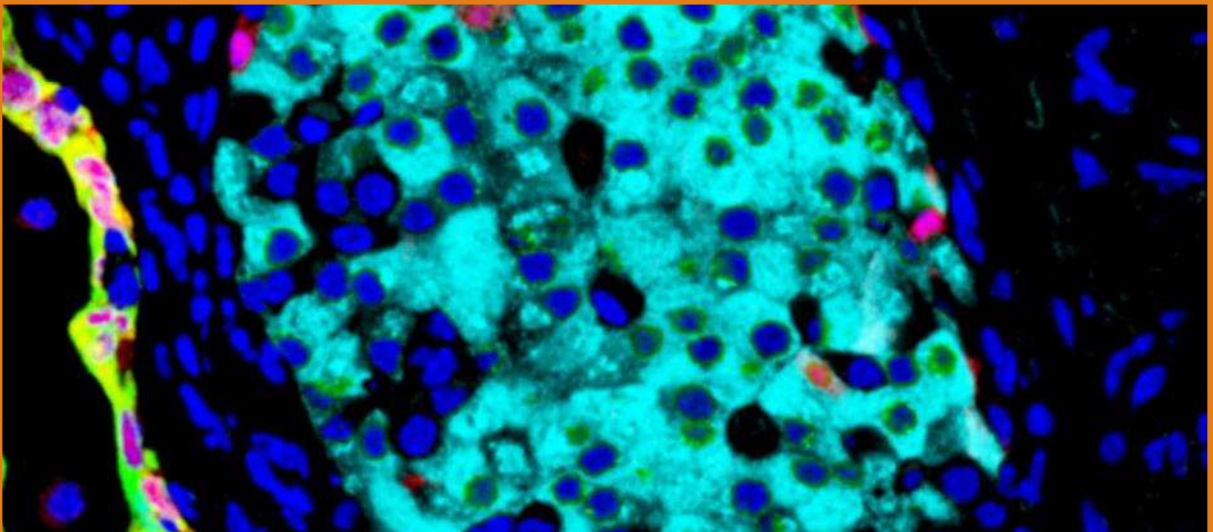

During 2021, the **PRBB organized 34 scientific conferences** (31 in 2020). 24 of them were PRBB CRG Conferences (19 online, 3 hybrids) and 10 neuroscience seminars (all online). These conferences are included in the park's **total of 242 scientific sessions** (202 in 2020).

The countries of the institutions of the **PRBB CRG Conferences** speakers were USA (8), Germany (3), United Kingdom (2) and one from Austria, Spain, Canada, Portugal, Switzerland, Denmark, Australia, the Netherlands, South Africa and France.

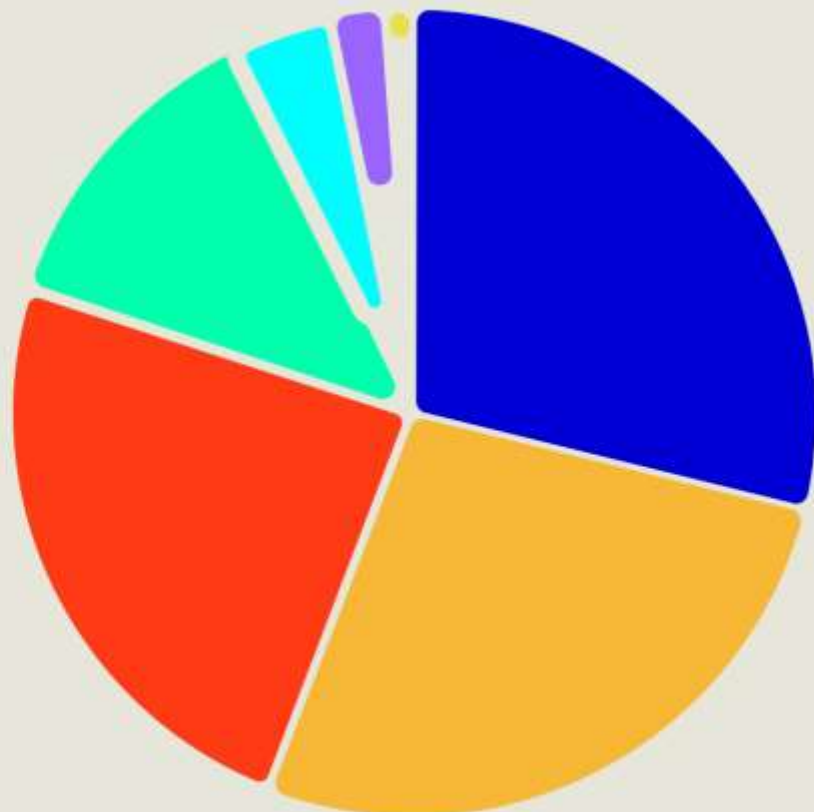

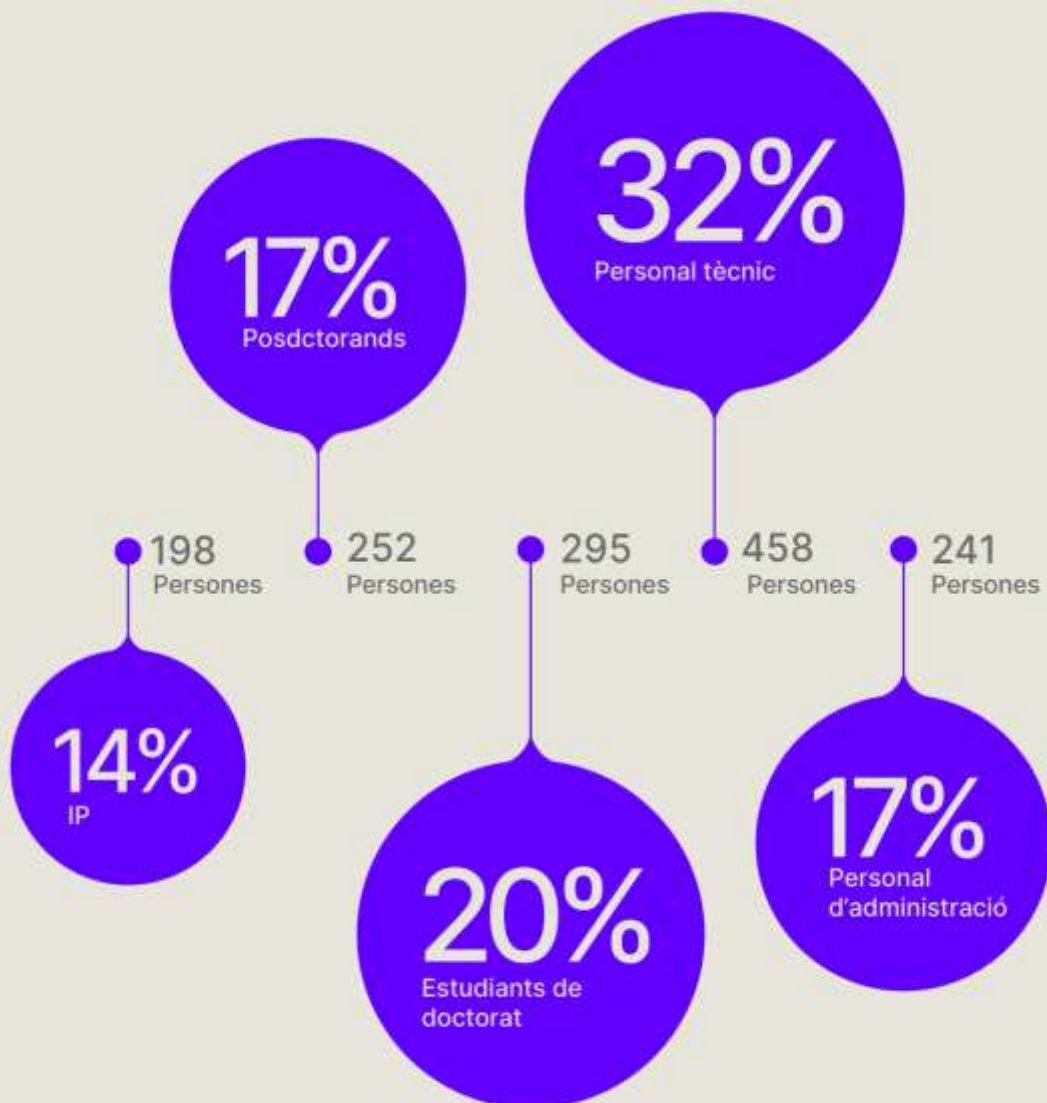

Residents by categories

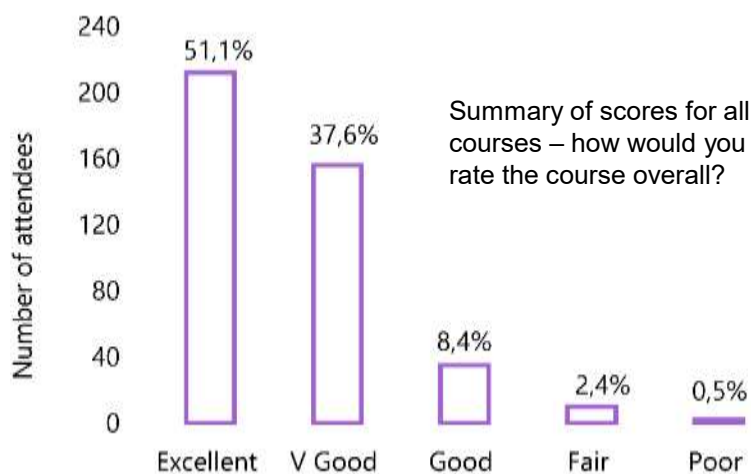
